Curriculum Information for Year 1/2—Autumn 2021

This term we will

Maths

Year 1

Learn how to:

- Represent and compare numbers to 20
- Read, write and order numbers to 20
- Find one more and one less
- Add and subtract numbers within 10
- Recognise and name 2D and 3D shapes

Year 2

Learn how to:

- Recognise the value of each digit in two-digit numbers
- Add and subtract ones or tens from any two-digit number
- Add and subtract 2 two-digit numbers
- Count on and back in 2s, 3s, 5s and 10s
- Read, write and order numbers to 100
- State 10 more or 10 less than a number to 100
- Recognise and count coins and notes

English

Listen to and read daily stories to enhance our enjoyment of books.

Through Sounds-Write learn that:

- Letters are symbols (spellings) that represent sounds
- A sound may be spelled by 1, 2, 3 or 4 letters
- The same sound can be spelled in more than one way
- Many spellings can represent more than one sound
- We can blend sounds to read and segment words into sounds for spelling

Learn how to:

Write to entertain and inform, working on the following skills:

Year 1

- Writing sentences using capital letters, full stops and finger spaces

Year 2

- Writing sentences using noun phrases, conjunctions (and, but, or) and proper nouns

Science

Learn about living things and plants by:

- Exploring the differences between things that are living, dead and things that have never been alive
- Observing and describing how seeds and bulbs grow into plants
- Investigate how plants need water, light and a suitable temperature to stay healthy
- Observing the changing seasons with a focus on autumn

Computing

Learn how to:

- Use the internet safely
- Stay safe using SMART rules

Learn that:

- There are many different common uses of information technology beyond school

Learn about:

- Tag rugby by developing movement and ball handling skills
- Football by developing movement and ball control skills

History

Learn about:

- Captain James Cook and Neil Armstrong and why they are significant

Learn how to:

- Compare people and periods of time

Art

Learn about:

- The artistic styles of Vincent Van Gogh
- Colour, texture and pattern including colour mixing

Geography

Learn about:

- Guisborough and London
- The human and physical features of both places
- The similarities and differences of these places

Learn how to:

- Select from and use a range of tools and materials to make a pop up card
