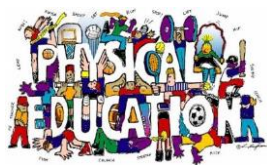

YEAR 4 SUMMER 2017

This term

Welcome back to what will be a very busy term in Year 4. At the end of this half term we will be going on our trip to Whitby which we are all really

excited about. In English we will be doing work on Myths and Legends before moving on to look at lots of different types of poetry. In maths. We will be revising division and finding fractions of quantities. We will be doing some more work on Roman numerals up to 100 (I - C). We will be looking at practical ways we can use addition and subtraction within different contexts including data handling.

Our topics this term will be based on our local area. In addition to the work we will be doing linked to our Whitby trip we are going to be doing lots of work based on Guisborough Priory and its importance to our town. In the second half of the term we will be visiting the priory to carry out some fieldwork. In science we will be undertaking work on Sound and the life cycles of plants. Our P.E. lessons will hopefully all be taken outside in the summer term, concentrating on athletics and orienteering. Our artwork this term will be based around Celtic knot work. In ICT we will be doing some work on data handling and Internet Safety. We will be singing a variety of songs throughout the term and will be using songs to develop our knowledge of French vocabulary as well as developing our musicality.

Homework

The summer term homework tasks have been organised and you should be receiving them shortly. Again we would ask that children complete five or six of the tasks set by the end of the summer term. We will be including a variety of shorter, medium and longer tasks for the children to choose from. Once again they will support/reflect the work we will be doing in school.

Weather

We are hoping that we will have some good weather throughout the summer term. If we do could we ask you to help us in a number of ways?

Firstly, please ensure children come to school with a water bottle. We have no drinking fountains in school and it is not hygienic for the children to use the taps in the toilets.

Children often like to remove their jumpers/cardigans in the warmer weather. Please could you ensure that all uniform is named. It is very difficult to distinguish one green jumper from another without.

We have had several children without P.E. kits recently which takes quite a lot of time out of the lesson finding replacement kit. Please ensure outdoor P.E. kit of plain white t-shirt, dark shorts and P.E. shoes or trainers is in school.

In addition to the usual school P.E. kit it would be a good idea for the children to also have a cap or sun hat they could wear for outdoor P.E. sessions.
