Communication and Language

Learn to:

- Demonstrate good listening and follow simple instructions.
- Express a point of view and share what I think.
- Take it in turns to speak.



Physical Development

Learn to:

- Develop movement using age appropriate equipment such as bikes, scooters etc.
- Show preferences for a dominant hand, using a comfortable pencil grip.



Practise:

- Drawing a picture.

Personal Social and Emotional Development

Continue practising:

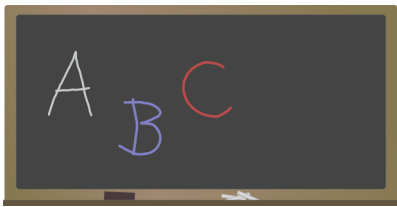
- How to play with others co-operatively.
- Taking care of my own toilet needs, and asking for help where needed.
- Talking about my feelings.
- Being aware of what I need to complete a short term task or goal.



Literacy

Learn to:

- Talk about stories I have heard and join in with a wider range of familiar rhymes and songs.
- Say the sounds for some letters.
- Write some letters from my name.
- Begin saying initial sounds for some words.



Mathematics

Practise

- Look at a number of objects and say how many there is, without counting– up to 5.
- Count to 5 using different resources.
- Count to 5 and beyond.

Learn to:

- Start to copy and continue repeating patterns.



Understanding of the World

Learn to:

- Talk about what I can see in the outside world.
- Recycle different materials in different ways.
- Understand peoples differences.
- Talk about the jobs of familiar adults and people in the community.



Expressive Arts and Design

Learn to:

- Join and explore materials.
- Develop my own ideas and then talk about them.
- Start to match melody and pitch of others.

Practise:

- Using my imagination, remembering songs and making up my own.
