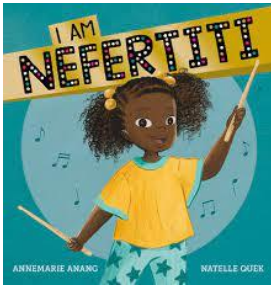
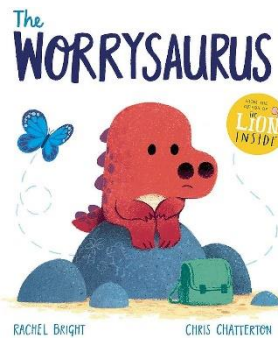


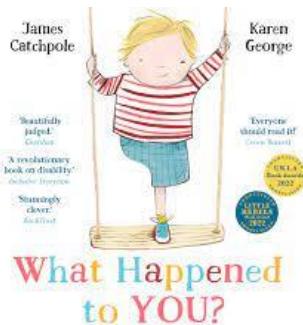
Nursery 2 Reading Spine



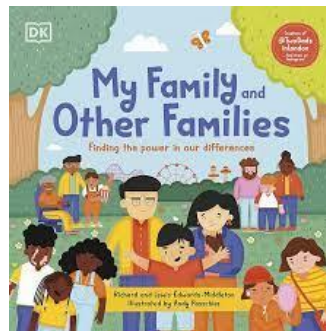
