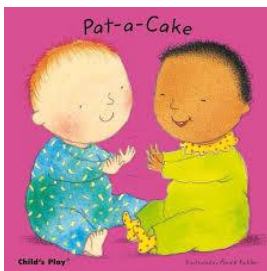


Nursery Rhymes
